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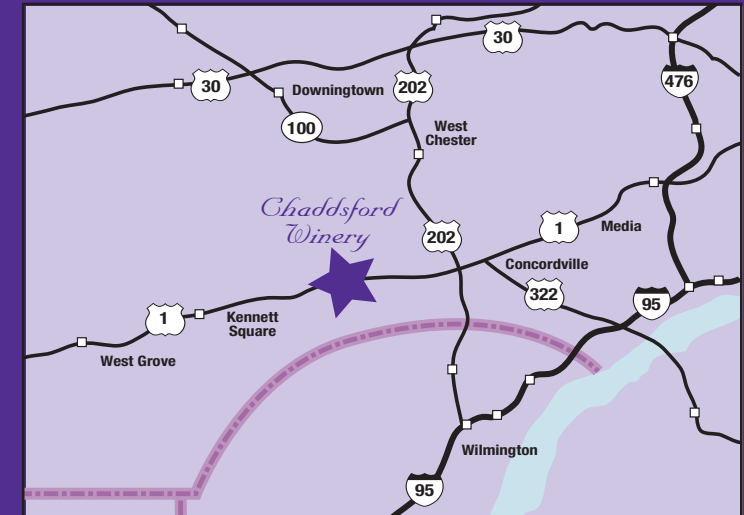
About Jayne Brown *Emcee for the Evening*

The Media Fellowship House

In 1944, after an African-American woman was refused service in a Media restaurant because of the color of her skin, the Media Interracial Fellowship was formed to address the issues of discrimination. The meeting places were a music studio on State Street, the Court House, Christ Episcopal Church, Media Meeting House and Beth Israel Community Center.

In 1953, a fund drive helped to purchase the Media Fellowship House on Jackson Street where membership is now over 300.

The mission of the MFH is to promote fellowship and understanding across cultures and generations, and to provide and participate in educational, cultural and service programs that meet the needs of our diverse community.

The Community Arts Center

The Community Arts Center in Wallingford was founded in 1948 by a group of local artists who believed that the arts were essential to individuals and the community as a whole. The Arts Center has nurtured the vision of the original founders, while expanding the scope of its programming and outreach.

CAC offers classes year round in the arts and related crafts for students of all ages and ability levels. The Arts Center also has a unique and innovative outreach program **ART to go** that provides arts experiences for organizations throughout the Delaware Valley. Last year, over 2000 students enrolled in classes at the Arts Center and an additional 1500 students participated in programs offered through **ART to go**.
